

The definite article (der, die, das)

First, you have to memorize the definite articles.

This is necessary because you can derive all other articles from the definite article.

Study the table beneath until you know the definite articles by heart.

Test yourself every now and then: Write the articles on a blank sheet of paper.

 Easy German Grammar Stories	Singular maskulin	Singular feminin	Singular neutral	Plural
1 Nominativ	der	die	das	die
2 Genitiv	des	der	des	der
3 Dativ	dem	der	dem	den
4 Akkusativ	den	die	das	die

- Nominative is the basic form (der, die, das).
- Accusative feminine and neutral: The definite article keeps the basic form (die, das)!
- **Accusative masculine**: The definite article changes to **den**.

The definite article + adjective

If an adjective follows the definite article, the adjective will have these endings:

- After the basic forms: **-e** (der kleine Mann, ...)
- **After all other forms: -en** (dem kleinen Mann, ...)

1 Nominativ	der (-e)	die (-e)	das (-e)	die (-en)
2 Genitiv	des (-en)	der (-en)	des (-en)	der (-en)
3 Dativ	dem (-en)	der (-en)	dem (-en)	den (-en)
4 Akkusativ	den (-en)	die (-e)	das (-e)	die (-en)

Summary:

1. Learn 16 articles
2. Adjectives after the basic forms get the ending **-e**.
3. Adjectives after **all other forms** get the ending **-en**.
