

The indefinite article, the possessive article and the negative article

Indefinite article: Das ist **ein** Ball./Das ist **eine** Lampe./Das ist **ein** Buch./Das sind Bücher. (**no article in plural!**)


Possessive article: Das ist **mein** Ball./Das ist **deine** Lampe./Das ist **sein** Buch./Das sind **meine** Bücher.

Negative article: Das ist **kein** Ball./Das ist **keine** Lampe./Das ist **kein** Buch./Das sind **keine** Bücher.

For easier understanding, I will use the possessive article from now on.

All following rules apply for the indefinite article and the negative article as well.

- The possessive article has the **ending of the definite article**.
- But the basic forms are different. In the nominative singular: **mein, meine, mein**.
- In the accusative feminine and neutral, the possessive article retains its **basic form**.

The indefinite article, the possessive article and the negative article + adjective

If an adjective follows the possessive article, the adjective receives the following endings:

- On basic forms: **-the ending of the definite article**
- **After all other forms: -en** (as with the definite article!).

(Attention: In the plural, there is no indefinite article; the adjective gets the ending of the definite article)

 Easy German Grammar Stories	Singular maskulin	Singular feminin	Singular neutral	Plural
1 Nominativ	mein (-er)	meine (-e)	mein (-es)*	meine (-en)
4 Akkusativ	meinen (-en)	meine (-e)	mein (-es)*	meine (-en)
3 Dativ	meinem (-en)	meiner (-en)	meinem (-en)	meinen (-en)
2 Genitiv	meines (-en)	meiner (-en)	meines (-en)	meiner (-en)

* The ending das of the definite article becomes -es for the adjective, so: mein kleines

For example: **Mein alter** Vater ist krank. **Meine alte** Mutter ist gesund. **Mein kleines** Kind ist gesund.
